Did You Know?

Did you know that the Ford Mustang was first introduced April 17th, 1964 at the New York World's Fair? Why the world's fair we ask? At the time the world's fair was the biggest, grandest consumer show of its kind for displaying products made in America for transportation, living and consumer electronics needs in such a way that was never repeated again. Google this and you will get 21 pages. More than 51 million people attended the fair over six months of 1964 and six months of 1965. Ford Motor Company presented "Ford's Magic Skyway". Using 50 Ford (motor less) convertibles, including Ford's new Mustangs, in an early prototype of what would become the People Mover ride system. This was said to be the second most popular exhibit at the fair. Mustang was a success and Ford Motor Co. sold 22,000 new Mustangs nationwide by the weekend that followed the April 17th introduction.
